

As a child I fell in love with lighthouses. They always represented to me a place a safety, a beacon in the storm. A distant lamp that lights the way. When we moved to Crescent City and I saw this beacon in the distance off shore. I marveled at not only its strange beauty and architecture but also wondered about the men who bult it. Thus, I started to read up on this amazing building on the distant rock. I knew I wanted to get involved and I had to get out there and see it.

Fast forward to today, I am now the Vice President of shore operations and have enjoyed the thrill of visiting the St. George Reef Lighthouse. This past Memorial Day was a wonderful experience as I was the first docent that our guests heard from. Sharing the history of the steamer Brother Jonathan and its loss on Dragon Rock, the conception of the lighthouse and some of the stories of its construction.

It was a thrill to see the faces of our guests as they departed the helicopter as they returned from the lighthouse. The smiles went from ear to ear. Some who even shared hugs and commented on what a thrill it was walk the stairs that so few have dared to even consider climbing.

I wish to express my heart felt thanks to both our shore staff and off shore staff. Without these amazing volunteers these tours would not be possible. As an organization we cannot survive without the tireless efforts of these volunteers.

I look forward to many years of service with the St. George Reef Lighthouse Preservation Society. We are always in need of volunteers, not only to assist as docents but laborers to make repairs to the building, to take reservations for tours as well as other assignments. We desperately need people to serve on the many committees that make all this happen. Please volunteer you will love every minute of it!



Just an update on the continuing work being done at St. George Reef Lighthouse. Over the past 20 to 30 years of restoration work there has accumulated a vast quantity of debris and refuse. During the last three trips to the island, some 1600 pounds of trash has been removed and it appears that there is still several hundred pounds of material needing to be removed.

The rusted and unstable stairs from the watch room to the lantern room has been removed, rebuilt and reinstalled.

Part of the old metal conduit in the spiral staircase has been removed in preparation of installing the first of two upgraded electrical systems. The first system is to be powered through our solar and battery system and the second to be powered by generators.

Many of the repairs made to the tower has had to be redone due to ongoing damage done by water from the winter storms. The 26 windows and 10 shutters that have been our main defense in stopping this damage are failing and need to be replaced. We have begun removing the old windows on the laundry and galley levels and will replace them temporarily with factory produced double pane tempered glass windows.

Plans have been drawn up to install a water treatment system to allow us to capture rain for our water needs and a self-contained composting sanitary system. Time and money are all that is needed to finish these projects.
