




Return to Saint George Reef Lighthouse


After a 4-year hiatus from tours and work weekends, Saint George Reef Lighthouse Preservation Society is back in business! We were able to secure greater access to the lighthouse both in days and time of year. Our deed restriction has been lifted so we can go out during the summer. In the last two years, we have been out to the sentinel two times... both times to repair the optic. The main challenge has been to find a helicopter to fly out to the lighthouse. Oregon Helicopter has been a good outfit to work with. They have worked with us every step of the way. A big thank you to Robert Walker of Oregon Helicopter and his two pilots Thomas Corbin and Caleb Bulten for a job well done. The event went well even though a fire almost forced us to cancel the tour. After realizing Highway 199 would be closed to the Roque Valley, we determined it would be best to reduce our event one day. Our tour quests cooperation was unbelievable and everyone worked together to accommodate the revised schedule. Thanks to all our tour guests and volunteers for pulling this off. We were able to bring in several consultants to look at the lighthouse and prioritize our tasks. Mark Cansdale, a lighthouse restoration specialist from New York State spent two days looking at the lighthouse top to bottom. Our board member and engineer, Mike Young and his daughter Cori Higgins also came out to make an evaluation and consult with Mr. Cansdale. Scott Sanders from Brookings Glass came as well to look over the lantern room glass and make recommendations. A big thank you to Mr. Paul Morgan of Crescent City for allowing the use of his vacation rental for the pilots and Ranell Chisman for the use of her car for their transportation. Russ and Marshann Burnette supplied housing for our visiting consultant. Jesse Roach, General manager at Ace Hardware in Crescent City and his friend Steven Stills spent the day running the stairs and hauling down debris for removal. In all, 24 people volunteered their time to make this happen. 121 people got the opportunity to see a spectacular engineering marvel up close and personal. The view is great as well!
























































Interview with Mark W. Miller, United States Coast Guard

To many in Crescent City, Mark W. Miller is a familiar face. He worked at the post office for 31 years; from 1974 until his retirement in 2005. Originally from Pennsylvania, Mark joined the Coast Guard in 1969 and spent time in Cape May, New Jersey. Later he attended Gunner's Mate school at Government Island, New York City. Transfer to the west coast found him at the Concord Naval Station in the bay area supervising stevedores loading munitions bound for Vietnam on Liberty ships. In 1970, Mark transferred to Crescent City to be a part of the Crew of the cutter 'Cape Carter' as Gunner's mate. Duties included patrolling the waters north to the Oregon border enforcing the 12-mile limit laws to fishing vessels from foreign countries. On emergency calls, Mark would be on the bridge of the 'Carter' when going on rescue missions. He once shot a line to a distressed vessel and hit the mark. Mark was on the bridge of the 'Carter' keeping the log during personnel transfers out at Saint George Reef Lighthouse. He recalled it being a challenge to get under the hook to load or unload materials and personnel without scraping against the rock. He said it happened twice but luckily only removed a little paint. A 44' boat from the Coast Guard station in Brookings, Oregon would stand by in case of emergencies during the transfer. Mark recalls there were no accidents during his tour. In 1972 Mark married his wife Linda and they are members of the Smith River Baptist church in Smith River, California. Mark was involved with the Saint George Reef Lighthouse stamp dedication several years ago with our late Society President, Guy Towers. The society asked Mark to be our guest August 31st, 2023, during our Labor Day weekend tour event out at the lighthouse. We were grateful he agreed. Thanks, Mark, for your service and for sharing your memories.




Guy Towers President 1939 - 2022


